New York	<p>The NYS Electronic Equipment Recycling and Reuse Act (Environmental Conservation Law, Article 27, Title 26) is based on the principles of product stewardship and extended producer responsibility. Under this law, manufacturers of covered electronic equipment (CEE) are primarily responsible for managing end-of-life devices, with oversight provided by the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC). Manufacturers of covered electronic equipment (CEE) are required to provide consumers a free and convenient opportunity to recycle their equipment brands or one piece of CEE from another manufacturer with the consumer's purchase of the same type.</p> <p>The Act enables a manufacturer of covered electronic equipment (CEE) to comply by implementing either an individual or collective electronic waste acceptance program.
