<p>California</p>	<p>California enacted the Electronic Waste Recycling Act (Act) of 2003 (SB 20, Sher, Chapter 526, Statutes of 2003) to establish a funding system for the collection and recycling of certain electronic wastes. The Covered Electronic Waste (CEW) Recycling Program is intended to provide convenient opportunities for all Californians to manage unwanted electronics properly. https://calrecycle.ca.gov/electronics/statutes/</p> <p>In compliance with the law, a fee is assessed on Covered Electronic Devices sold in California. The fee(s) will appear on your invoice if the Ship-To-Address is in California and the purchased products contain a video display device. This includes most video display devices with a screen size, measured diagonally, greater than four inches, such as computer monitors, televisions, laptop computers, smart displays, tablets, and portable DVD players.</p> <p>Covered Electronic Devices identified in the regulations https://dtsc.ca.gov/covered-electronic-devices/</p> <p>Current Fees (January 1, 2020, forward) https://calrecycle.ca.gov/electronics/recyclingfee/</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ \$4 on a screen more than four inches but less than 15 inches. ○ \$5 on a screen more than 15 inches but less than 35 inches; and ○ \$6 on a screen measuring 35 inches or more. <p>*Beginning on January 1, 2026, consumers will pay the recycling fee for covered battery-embedded products at the time of purchase.</p> <p>Are any sales exempt from the fee? You must have an exempt cert on file with Dell Tax. ○ Sales to Native Americans on Native American reservations. ○ Sales of CEDs the retailer ships directly to a location outside California, when the transaction is not subject to California sales or use tax.
